


The Guardian Angel



"Tell us, Sister, what exactly happened during the first apparitions about which little or nothing has been said?" * This is the question that Sister Lúcia answered in chapter two of *Calls* and forms the subject of today's column. It pertains to the apparition of an angel in 1914 or 1915.

One day when we were on the slopes of the hill known as the *Cabeço*, we saw something like a white cloud in the shape of a human being, which had come down from the sky and was passing slowly in front of us, above the trees that stretched down to the valley at our feet, as if wishing to attract our attention and keep our eyes fixed on it.

What was it?

My reply today is the same as it was then: *I do not know what it was nor what it meant*. But I was left with an interior conviction ... that it was the Guardian Angel. Perhaps in that form and without speaking, he wished to make his presence felt and so prepare souls for the accomplishment of God's designs.

Lúcia goes on to write about guardian angels, a truth of the Catholic faith. Each of us has an angel to walk with us through life, to help and to guard us. Several passages in the Holy Bible speak of this mystery.

- 1) Exodus 23:20-21—An angel accompanied the Israelites across the desert to the Promised Land.
- 2) Genesis 28:11-14—In a dream, Jacob saw a ladder from earth to heaven with angels ascending and descending on it.
- 3) Matthew 1:18-25—An angel appeared to Joseph to reveal that the Virgin Mary had conceived her child through the power of the Holy Spirit.
- 4) Matthew 2:1-23—An angel appeared in dreams to Joseph and to the Magi from the East to warn them about danger from King Herod.
- 5) Genesis 32:1-32—Angels guarded and blessed Jacob.
- 6) Matthew 18:10—Jesus spoke about angels who behold His heavenly Father's face.
- 7) Luke 1:8-13—The angel Gabriel appeared to Zechariah and promised that Elizabeth his wife would bear a son whose name would be John.
- 8) Luke 1:26-38—The angel Gabriel appeared to the Blessed Virgin Mary to ask her to become the Mother of the Lord.
- 9) Luke 2:8-20—Angels appeared to the shepherds of Bethlehem to announce the good news of the Birth of the Messiah and Lord.
- 10) Genesis 3:24—Angels of the Cherubim Order kept Adam and Eve from reentering Eden.
- 11)

God created angels and human beings to serve, praise, and love Him and to enjoy eternal happiness in Heaven.

Bearing these truths in mind, it will not seem so strange to us that God should have once again chosen to make use of one of his Angels in order to address to us yet another call to obey his law and remember the end for which we were created.

This is the final bulletin article in the series on *Calls from the Message of Fatima*. The cycle began on Sunday, August 4, 2019 (in those pre-pandemic times that seem so long ago) and stretched over a year and a half of weekly bulletins to April 11, 2021. We began with chapter three, which was about the first of the twenty calls or appeals of the Message. Only after reaching the end of the book (chapter 37) did we return to the first two chapters, which form an atrium or anteroom to *Calls*.

It has been a joy to wrestle with this most important work of Sister Lúcia dos Santos. I hope that you will be inspired to read her spiritually enriching book, which shows us that the Message of Fatima is all about our reaching Heaven successfully. Let's not forget to pray for her beatification and canonization, so that she may be honored at the altars along with her cousins Saints Jacinta and Francisco Marto.

THE SAINTS - OUR EXTENDED FAMILY IN HEAVEN

MONDAY, APRIL 12
Saint Alferius of La Cava



Member of the noble Pappacarbone family. Ambassador for Duke Gisulf of Salerno, Italy. When he fell seriously ill at the abbey of Chiusa, Italy, he made the common promise to God that if he lived, he would enter religious life. When he recovered, he became a monk at Cluny, France, training under Saint Odilo of Cluny. Duke Gisulf recalled him to Salerno to reform the monasteries in his region.

Alferius met with little success, and in 1011 he became a hermit on Mount Fenestra near Salerno. His reputation for holiness and wisdom spread, and he attracted students. He selected twelve, and founded the Benedictine abbey *Holy Trinity of La Cava* under the Cluniac rule. The abbey became the motherhouse for scores of others in the region; this network of houses became a powerful force for civilization and religion in Sicily and southern Italy, and twelve of the motherhouse abbots have been beatified to date. Alferius lived to be 120, governing the abbey till the day he died; on that day, he celebrated

Mass, and washed the feet of his brothers, including the future Pope Blessed Victor III.

TUESDAY, APRIL 13
Blessed Margaret of Castello



Born a blind, lame, deformed, hunchback midget. When she was six years old, her noble parents walled her up beside a chapel; she could

not get out, but could attend Mass and receive the Sacraments. After 14 years of imprisonment, her parents took her to a shrine to pray for a cure. When none occurred, they abandoned her. She became a lay Dominican, and spent her life in prayer and charity. When she died, the townspeople thronged her funeral, and demanded she be buried in a tomb inside the church. The priest protested, but a crippled girl was miraculously cured at the funeral, and he consented.

Born: 1287 at Maercatello sul Metauro, Pesaro-Urbino, Italy
Died: April 13, 1320 in Citta di Castello, Perugia, Italy of natural causes
Beatified: October 19, 1609 by Pope Paul V (concession of indult for Mass and Office)

FRIDAY, APRIL 16
Saint Benedict Joseph Labre



Oldest of fifteen children in a prosperous middle class family. Educated by his uncle, a parish priest. Following his uncle's death, he tried to join the Trappists, Carthusians, and Cistercians, but was rejected by them all. He spent years wandering Europe, especially Rome, Italy, in complete poverty, spending his days in perpetual adoration in the cathedrals. Given to religious ecstasies when contemplating the crown of thorns; reputed to float, soar, and bilocate when in these swoons. He begged in the streets, and if he was given more than he needed for the day, he would give the remainder to some one he considered more in need than he was. Benedict healed some of his fellow homeless, and was reported to have multiplied bread for them. Noted counselor to people of all walks in Rome. He died in a hospice, exhausted from his life of austerity. His biography, written by his confessor Marconi, describes 136 miraculous cures attributed to him within three months of his death.





THE RESURRECTION OF CHRIST

Taken from the "Encyclopedia of Catholic Doctrine"



That body possesses new properties, having become spiritual and glorified, and no longer subject to the limitations of material beings and of the human body. But it is authentic and real. In his material identity, there is proof of Christ's Resurrection. The meeting on the road to Emmaus shows in a particularly vivid way that conviction

about the Resurrection matured in the minds of the disciples through contact with the risen Christ (cf. Lk 24:15-21). Sadness and disappointment give way to a total transformation. The certainty of the Resurrection made them, as it were, new men.

Historical Event Transcending History

At the dawn of the third day after Jesus' burial by Joseph of Arimathea, the tomb was found empty. The women who went to the tomb encountered an angel who said to them: "You seek Jesus who was crucified; he is not here. He has risen as he said" (Mt 28:5-6).

There are three reasons why this event transcends history. First, no one saw the Resurrection. Certainly Christ's body was no longer in the tomb. No one was an eyewitness of the event itself. No one could say how it had happened in its physical reality. Second, the senses could not perceive the interior essence of the passage to another life. It is this transhistorical feature of the Resurrection that must especially be considered if we are to understand to some extent the mystery of that historical, but also transhistorical, event. Third, Christ did not simply return to earthly life, like those whom he had raised from the dead during his public ministry: Lazarus, the daughter of Jairus, the son of the widow of Naim. In his risen body, Christ passed from death to another life beyond space and time. This risen body of Jesus was filled with the power of the Holy Spirit and shared in the divine life of glory. He is now the "heavenly man" (1 Cor 15:47). In this sense, Christ's Resurrection eludes the criteria of simple empirical observation. In his contacts with others after the Resurrection, this real dimension of his humanity conceals another life that is now his and that withdraws him from ordinary earthly life and plunges him into mystery.

The Resurrection takes place through the power of the Father, who had raised Christ his Son (Acts 2:32) and introduced his humanity - even his body - into the communion of the Trinity. St. Paul insists that this is a manifestation of the power of God through the work of the Spirit, who is raising Jesus placed him in the glorious sphere of Lord (*Kyrios*), where he definitively merits the name Son of God that belonged to him from eternity.
