



Chapter 8. The Liturgy of the Eucharist Holy Mass: The Eucharistic Prayer (Canon): Sacrifice of Christ and His Church, Part Two *

FROM THE Pastor's Desk

At the Last Supper, Jesus offered the first Mass. Jesus Himself made the offering by pronouncing the words of Consecration over the bread and wine. In all other Masses, Jesus works through the ministry of ordained priests. As He said during the Last Supper, "Do this in remembrance of me."

As a minister of Christ and dispenser of the mysteries of God (2 Cor. 4:1), an ordained priest acts in the name and person of Christ Himself. Just as the one Sacrifice of the Cross is made present in every Mass, so also "the one priesthood of Christ is made present through the ministerial priesthood without diminishing the uniqueness of Christ's priesthood." * Through the priestly ministry, "Christ shows objectively his presence and action in the Church and unites believers to his sacrifice." **

"In itself, the sacrifice of the Cross was perfect and sufficed for obtaining all graces for salvation In its sacramental representation [in the Mass], it pours forth its fruits more widely." "The Eucharistic sacrifice is the sacrifice of Christ: Christ is the victim and also the priest ... who works through ministers who act in his name. But the [Mass] is at the same time a sacrifice of the Church Jesus wants the Church to be involved in His sacrifice and "to make Christ's sacrifice [her] own." The Mass is "an action of Christ the Priest and of his body the Church." Members of the Church become personally involved in the offering of Christ's sacrifice and unite themselves to Jesus in His offering for the salvation of the world.

Chapter 9 of Book Four of the *Imitation of Christ* is a beautiful chapter showing us how to offer ourselves and all that is ours to God at Mass and pray for the salvation of all people. I invite you to read and pray that chapter. We offer to the Lord ourselves, our good deeds, and our sins and wrongdoing, asking God to burn and consume them in the fire of his love. We offer the needs of parents, friends, brothers and sisters, and all who are dear to us. We offer prayers for those who have hurt us and for those whom we have hurt in word or deed, consciously or not. It is a wonderful prayer that we can make our own.

The Mass has a fourfold efficacy in virtue of the fourfold finality of sacrifice: adoration (latreutic), <a href="mailto:the-mailto:th

Propitiation and the **obtaining of graces** are for the living and for the dead. Throughout the history of the Church, there has been the conviction that offering Mass for our deceased brothers and sisters "can benefit the departed and obtain their everlasting happiness." We have power to intercede on behalf of the dead. Even more, offering Mass for the deceased has "an efficacy which is ... superior to that of any entreaty or prayer." Offering Mass for the living also can obtain for them great graces and benefits.

The Priest may apply the value of the Mass he celebrates to a particular intention. Customarily, he accepts a set monetary stipend from the donor requesting the intention. Although there is a single sacrifice when two or more priests concelebrate Mass, each concelebrant "can dedicate the value of his participation to a specific intention [because] each concelebrant brings a participation in the act of offering and it is in virtue of this participation that [the concelebrant] can apply his contribution to the value of the sacrifice for a particular intention."

Individual intentions do not and cannot "absorb all of the efficacy of the Mass. The offering of the Eucharistic sacrifice produces fruits that surpass particular and expressly recalled intentions." The fruit of every Mass is "an ever greater development of the life of the Church." That's why "it is true that ... the Church produces the Eucharist, but it is also true that the Eucharist produces the Church."


